Summary of the Program by Plan Thailand :

1. Program:

Child Protection Partnership (CPP) Thailand, April 2010-March 2011

The Child Protection Partnership is a multi-sector collaboration of international organizations dedicated to protecting children from sexual exploitation and other threats enabled by the use of ICT, including mobile phones, cameras and computers. Plan Thailand and the International Institute for Child Rights and Development (IICRD) will be leading and working with many partners from different sectors in an array of social systems (e.g. legal system, education system) that affect children's lives. CPP facilitates collaboration making the links between systems and uses technology and integrated approaches to group learning that contribute to making ICT a safer tool for Children's development and flourishing in Thailand.

a. Objective of the program :

1. To develop a school based curriculum on ICT awareness, safety and child protection
2. To develop school based community child protection programs using ICT in partnership with law enforcement and child protection agencies
3. To develop a policy/legislative round tables

b. Expected roles of the interns :

- Assisting in compiling and analyzing legal instruments, information and data on ICT in relation to child protection issues, identifying gaps and areas for improvement in national legislation on the issues. (The intern could carry out this assignment in conjunction with a consultant hired for Plan-IICRD on Children and ICT Policy Working Group. However, there is a limitation as most of the documents are in Thai)
- Assisting in compiling and analyzing information on national responses with regards to protecting children from ICT enabled child sexual exploitation including analyzing how the

- private sector, the civil society, academic institutes, local administrative bodies including NGOs and community based organizations help promote the safe use of internet and other communication technologies among children and young people.
- Assisting in establishing a directory of institutions working to promote ICT awareness, online safety and child protection and updating/ maintaining contacts of CPP Thailand.
 - Participating in the preparation and implementation of CPP activities in some specific tasks including meetings, seminars, and workshops, training sessions and assisting in undertaking assessment of CPP activities.
 - Assisting in the preparation of timely submission of project progress reports, annual reports and/or any other required reports.
 - Assisting in communications campaigns to promote the work of CPP Thailand.

2. **Program:**

Programme impact assessment and shared learning for planning, accountability and learning system.

a. **Objective of the program:**

- Research and Review on Issues of child rights programme areas of Plan Thailand.
- Develop of shared learning document and processes to the team.

b. **Expected roles of the interns:**

- Assist Corporate Planning Monitoring Evaluation Manager in research and review on issues that related to programme areas (Both desk review and data collection in the field)
- Mapping of NGOs and organization that working related to Plan Thailand programmes.
- Assist CMPEM in develop on shared learning processes such as report, newsletter and journal to the team and key actors (partner organization, community members, children)

3. **Other programs** that would interested to the interns:

- *The Universal Birth Registration (UBR) policy*
- *The Early Childhood and Child Care Development (ECCD)*
- *Learn Without Fear Program, domestic violence and child trafficking.*

The intern's roles are expected to study and analyze of the above policies for Thailand in comparison to other countries and provide recommendation of how policy is effectively made.
